CCCAM Increases Coaches Education

The Competitive Cheer Coaches Association of Michigan (CCCAM) made a commitment three years ago to increase education for its members by bringing in nationally recognized keynote speakers for its fall summit.

This year the summit will feature nationally recognized personal coach and motivational speaker, Shannon Oleen. Ms. Oleen, former NFL Cheerleader, shares her charm, enthusiasm and inspiring words as she presents each audience member with the tools and motivation to harness their potential and achieve their dreams. A few of her national workshop titles include:

Defining Your Personal Brand -- Merging what they see with who you are.

Leadership Building Blocks -- What kind of leader are you?

Working With Millennials -- Communication tips for engagement in the workplace.

Keynote speakers from previous years have included Rob Miller from Proactive Coaching, and Dr. Gregory Dale, Director of Sports Psychology and Leadership Programs for Duke Athletics.

The fall summit is the educational highlight of the year for CCCAM Members. The CCCAM Summit is held each Fall and it brings together coaches from across the state to share knowledge of the sport. The summit offers more than 20 educational sessions, a rules meeting and networking opportunities. CCCAM has also offered free CPR classes, as well as free CAP training for its members at the fall summit. This year's summit is October 23 at the Lansing Crowne Plaza.

The Basketball Coaches Association of Michigan is now the largest state basketball organization in the country. The organization is in its 40th year of operation and was incorporated in 1976. It is the brainchild of Tom Hursey and Ron Vondette.

A few of the benefits, focuses and hot items for the group are:

- our very successful awards programs, including being a partner in the Miss and Mr. Basketball award which is the preeminent award that a high school player can receive. We also award several other academic, team and individual awards to high school and college coaches and players throughout the state.

- The Reaching Higher Showcase – this is a showcase for the top girls and boys players in the state that BCAM and the MHSAA collaborate on.

- Seeding the state tournament. This is always a hot topic, and one that will take a lot of work, but could have some positive implications down the road

- The possibility of adding to the 20 game max for regular season games

- Improving the relationship and communication with AAU coaches and high school coaches

- Sport specialization and the push to create more two and three sport athletes

As you can see, the BCAM Board and its members have a very positive impact on basketball throughout the state of Michigan. The organization continues to grow and works together with the MHSAA to maintain and improve basketball in our great state.

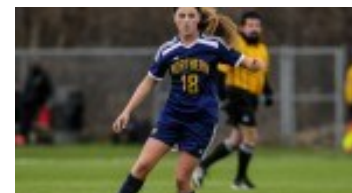
